CALGARY, February 16, 2001 - **Birch Mountain Resources Ltd. (BMD:CDNX)** issued a news release on September 27, 2000, which stated that the company had agreed with the Canadian Venture Exchange (CDNX) to an independent technical audit. The CDNX retained Associated Mining Consultants Ltd. (AMCL) of Calgary to conduct the technical audit.

Birch Mountain Resources Ltd. considers the audit process to be flawed and disagrees with a number of the conclusions.

The following are AMCL's conclusions:

All the assay results quoted in the BMD news releases are supported by assay certificates or reports from laboratories. There is no evidence to suggest that any of the samples were tampered with in any manner.

In our opinion, there is limited disclosure of negative results, repeated disclosure of the same positive results in different contexts and promotional and misleading statements in the BMD news releases.

The Company believes that it has identified nano-particulate material (nano-clusters) in slides prepared for scanning electron microscopy (SEM) through use of energy dispersive X-ray analysis. The Company believes that normal mining assay methodologies have not established the presence of gold, reliably or reproducibly, as the gold occurs in a new form which is not amenable to aqua regia leach or fire-assay pre-concentration. It is our opinion that even if gold or other precious metals are present in the samples, the concentrations are so low as to be near to or below the detection limit of the analytical methods.

It is our opinion that the majority of competent assayers examining the BMD data would come to the conclusion that there is little precious metal in the BMD samples of Athabasca rocks and that the sporadic positive results reported are due to interferences, contamination or other known reasons. The only convincing evidence that would be accepted that there is significant metal values in the Athabasca rocks is for BMD to consistently produce gold or other precious metal, in metallic form, from their samples, which, so far, they have failed to do.

BMD claim to have identified a new form of naturally occurring precious metal. The

nano-particles identified by BMD are analysed as non-precious metal (the specific metal is not identified at the request of BMD). The CANMET report specifically states that the non-precious metal is crystalline and gives its crystal structure as the face-centred cubic structure. No precious metal nano-particles have been observed by BMD. It is therefore misleading to suggest that BMD have confirmed a new form of naturally occurring precious or other metal.

It would be presumptuous to totally dismiss the theories of BMD regarding the potential for precious metals as nano-particles or micro-particles in the Athabasca rocks. However, such work is the domain of research institutions rather than a junior mining company. If the company is to pursue this high-risk research as its main activity, then this should be made clear to the investing public. AMCL is of the opinion that the current research focus represents a “material change of business” for the Company.

AMCL is of the opinion that BMD’s research is based on a hypothesis that does not permit verification by conventional and internationally accepted assay or chemical methodologies. At this time we cannot recommended any testing program.

BMD has insisted that any references within the text of this report, that refer to, or may possibly compromise, a U.S. patent application be deleted. AMCL has suggested to Birch that this represents an area of concern for the Exchange, as to whether BMD actually has any specific item or technology which may in fact be patentable. AMCL has raised this issue with Officers of the Company but at the date of this report has not received any answer or suggestion as to how to resolve this issue.

AMCL has obtained and had analysed, commercially available gold colloid sols in the 5 nm particle size range using conventional (mining) assay methodologies.

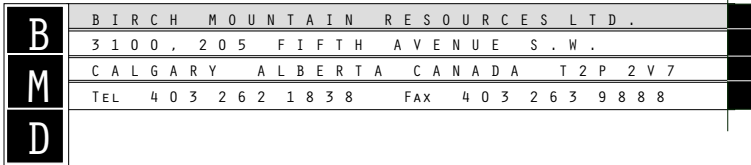

CALGARY, March 14, 2001 - Birch Mountain Resources Ltd. (BMD:CDNX) advises that on March 8, 2001, it filed an appeal with the Alberta Securities Commission pursuant to section 53.6 of the *Securities Act* (Alberta) requesting a review of the decision of the CDNX to suspend trading. Birch Mountain took this action in response to the suspension of trading and the bulletin issued by the CDNX that stated, "The shares of the Company will be suspended at the close of trading March 5, 2001 pursuant to Rule C.1.07. The Exchange is reviewing issues that arise from the findings of the technical audit conducted by Associated Mining Consultants Ltd. and from its own review of the Company affairs."

The grounds of the appeal are that, in the opinion of Birch Mountain:

- (a) the Company cooperated fully with the CDNX and Associated Mining Consultants Ltd. ("AMCL");
- (b) the decision of the CDNX to suspend trading was not factually supported by the AMCL Audit Report;
- (c) the audit process was flawed and the Company disagrees with most of the conclusions reached by AMCL;
- (d) AMCL did not consider a significant body of data available to it; and
- (e) AMCL failed to consider information contradictory to its opinions and that certain of the conclusions rendered were beyond the terms of reference of the audit agreed to with the CDNX, and disclosed in Birch Mountain's September 27, 2000 News Release.

CALGARY, March 23, 2001 - Birch Mountain Resources Ltd. (BMD:CDNX) has received a report dated March 20, 2001, from the University of Calgary which independently confirms the occurrence of copper and iron nanoparticles in chain-of-custody rock from its Athabasca mineral property and in extract solutions independently prepared from this rock using a proprietary Birch Mountain extraction protocol. The report provides independent confirmation of a key element of the Company's exploration model and extraction technology.

The rock used, channel sample SMSBM-4, was collected in the field by an independent consultant ("Consultant") in May, 1999. Sample SMSBM-4 is one of seven samples collected from the walls of a 12 by 9 metre pit located approximately two kilometers northeast of the bridge crossing the Athabasca River along Highway 63 and four kilometers southeast of Fort McKay at location: UTM zone 12, 464143E, 6334562N (NAD 27). The pit is part of a larger excavation made to supply material for the construction of Highway 63.

The Consultant describes sample SMSBM-4 as follows:

Sample	Type	True Thickness (cm)
SMSBM-4	Brown clay intercalated in limestone	130

The Consultant reported that sample preparation was done at different times at Lakefield Research, Lakefield, Ontario, and at XRAL Laboratories, Don Mills, Ontario. The pulverized rock sample was returned to the Consultant and recombined.

A split of pulverized rock sample SMSBM-4 was sent directly to Loring Laboratories Ltd. ("Loring"), Calgary, Alberta, by the Consultant. A 5 gram split of the unprocessed pulverized rock sample was sent directly to the Microscopy and Imaging Facility, University of Calgary, by Loring. Loring prepared solution extracts in duplicate from 30 gram splits of sample SMSBM-4 using an extraction protocol supplied by Birch Mountain and fresh reagents delivered directly to Loring by a chemical supplier. The solution extract was sent directly to the University of Calgary by Loring. The custody of all samples, reagents and extracts was maintained independent of Birch Mountain at all times.

Pulverized rock samples and solution extracts were analyzed by transmission electron microscope at the University of Calgary. A report prepared by the University of Calgary identified the two samples as follows:

"Sample 1 was a flocculent from an extraction solution of SMSBM-4."

"Sample 2 was a pulverized rock sample, number SMSBM-4."

The University of Calgary report concludes:

“Both Sample 1 and Sample 2 contain particles approximately 10-20 nm in size, composed of copper at levels that are at least an order of magnitude above the TEM instrument’s detectable limits. Two particles in SMSBM-4 also contain Fe.”

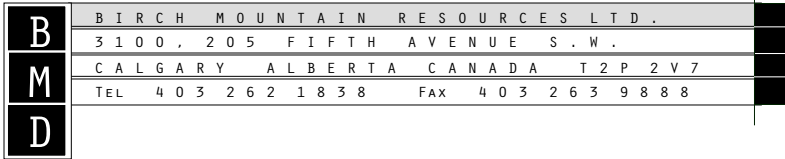
The abbreviation “nm” stands for “nanometer”.

Birch Mountain reminds readers that the results reported here are not quantitative estimates of nanoparticle concentrations and can only be taken as independent confirmation of the presence of nanoparticles in rocks and solution extracts. The results do not address the concentrations of nanoparticles contained in either the rock or the solution extract.

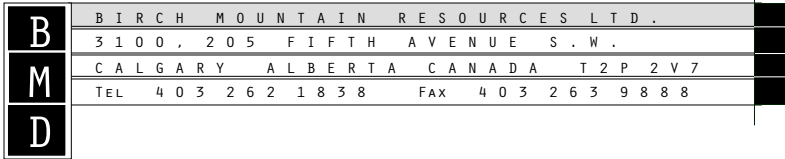

CALGARY, November 2, 2001 – Birch Mountain Resources Ltd. (CDNX – “BMD”), Marum Resources Inc. (CDNX – “MMU”) and Shear Minerals Ltd. (CDNX – “SRM”) announce that they have executed an option agreement whereby Marum and Shear can earn up to a 90% interest (45% Marum, 45% Shear) in the diamond rights of the Birch Mountain property in northeastern Alberta.

The property in the Birch Mountains consists of 10 mineral exploration permits covering approximately 90,000 hectares, or 10 townships, located 100km northwest of Fort McMurray, Alberta. Aeromagnetic data indicates the presence of a population of distinct high-intensity magnetic anomalies. This cluster of anomalies occurs at moderate elevations within the Birch Mountains where overburden thickness is expected to be thin.

The option agreement is subject to the approval of the Boards of Directors of the three parties to the agreement and regulatory approval. Marum has agreed to pay 100,000 shares to Birch Mountain. Shear has agreed to pay 50,000 shares to Birch Mountain. Marum and Shear are equal partners in the option and will enter into a joint venture agreement with standard mutual dilution provisions. Shear will be the operator of the project, subject to the approval of Birch Mountain. Marum and Shear can earn a total of 30% interest in the diamond rights by spending \$150,000 on exploration during the first year of the option, including the drilling of three drill holes to greater than 50 metres depth below the base of glacial till. Marum and Shear can earn an additional 30% interest in diamond rights by spending a further \$150,000 within two years of the signing of the agreement and a final 30% diamond rights interest, for a total of 90%, by spending an additional \$250,000 within three years of the signing of the agreement. Birch Mountain will retain a 10% carried interest in the project and will hold a 2% gross overriding royalty on diamond production from the property. Marum and Shear may purchase 1% of the gross overriding royalty at any time for a payment of \$2,000,000.

Marum and Shear have appointed Apex Geoscience of Edmonton to act as project manager and Qualified Person.

Birch Mountain Resources has agreed to pay a finder's fee of 10% of the shares received from Marum and Shear.

CALGARY, November 16, 2001 – Birch Mountain Resources Ltd. (CDNX – BMD) wishes to update shareholders on the trading status of its common shares.

Birch Mountain has reported the history of events from June 15, 2000, and the agreement to accept an independent technical audit on September 27, 2000, in previous news releases and the Annual Report. The audit conclusions were reported in a news release on February 16, 2001, together with the statement that Birch Mountain considers the audit process to be flawed and disagrees with a number of the conclusions. On February 27, 2001 the Canadian Venture Exchange Inc. ("CDNX") suspended trading in the shares of Birch Mountain, citing the findings of the technical audit report by Associated Mining Consultants Ltd. as the reason, though the specific issues have never been defined by the CDNX. On March 9, 2001, the Corporation filed an appeal of the trading suspension with the Alberta Securities Commission ("ASC").

Birch Mountain has pressed to resolve this matter as quickly as possible. To ensure a full and fair review, the Corporation has requested a new hearing in order for a panel to examine evidence that was not properly considered in the technical audit and to table new information. Following the filing of its submission, together with supporting documentation, to the ASC on October 30, 2001, Birch Mountain was advised by lawyers acting for the CDNX to "...make application to the Canadian Venture Exchange to reconsider its decision in light of the new evidence that you wish to have considered." The Corporation is in the process of responding.

In light of the continuing uncertainty regarding the trading market in Canada, management of the Corporation began exploring alternative markets for the common shares. In that connection, Birch Mountain filed a registration statement with the US Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"), a prerequisite to development of a US market for the common shares. Birch Mountain cleared SEC review of the registration statement in May 2001, and in August 2001, a market maker filed a Form 211 with the National Association of Securities Dealers ("NASD") to begin quotation of the common shares on the OTC Bulletin Board. The market maker was recently informed by the NASD that there is a deficiency in the Form 211, but the deficiency was not identified. Birch Mountain believes that the NASD delay is a result of the CDNX trading suspension. The market maker and Birch Mountain are working together to resolve any issues that the NASD may have, but there can be no assurance that these issues will be resolved until resolution of the CDNX trading suspension.
